

Explore the River Arrow Catchment

The **source** is where a river begins. This might be on a hill, mountain, or where water comes out of the ground. The River Arrow has three **sources** in Wales.

A **catchment** is the area of land where all the rainwater drains into the same river.

A **tributary** is a smaller river or stream that flows into a bigger river. The River Arrow has several **tributaries**.

A **confluence** is the place where two rivers or streams meet and join together. The River Arrow has a **confluence** with the River Lugg to the South East of Leominster.

A **settlement** is a place where people live, such as a village, town, or city.

A **floodplain** is flat land next to a river that can flood when the river has lots of water.

Wetlands are areas of land that are often wet or flooded, like marshes or swamps, and are homes for many plants and animals.

A **bridge** is a structure built over a river so people, animals, or vehicles can cross from one side to the other.
